Report

Background

At the County of Brant O.P.P. Detachment Board’s request, staff compile statistics on O.P.P. response to false alarms on an ongoing basis. This report includes statistics from January 2024 to January 2025.

In 2019, following a review and recommendations from the former Police Services Board, County of Brant Council approved an escalating fee scale for at-fault false alarms. The escalating fee schedule was implemented at that time as a strategy to reduce the unnecessary use of police resources in response to false alarms.

The County’s Fees and Charges were further updated on April 1, 2024, to the following:

That the County’s fees and charges by-law be updated, effective April 1, 2024, as follows:

Number of Responses to At Fault False Alarms. Fee schedule to reset per new property owner, or following two (2) years since the last at fault false alarm for a property owner:

	<u>Fee:</u>
1 st	Warning letter only
2 nd	\$150
3 rd	\$250
4 th	\$350
5th +	\$500

The fee schedule will reset when an address has a new property owner, or following two (2) years since the last at fault false alarm for a property owner.

The Board approved a Progressive Communications Plan to Address Repeat False Alarms at the meeting on January 28, 2025.

In January 2025 the number of responses to false alarms is lower than the experience of January 2024, with a decrease of 42%; however, there are more repeat visits, resulting in fines of \$950.

Of the repeat visits, one property accounts for 6 responses during the month of January. Staff intend to follow up with this property owner.

Further to the questions asked at the previous Board meeting in February, the top repeat properties in 2024 have paid all invoices for false alarm fees charged, with the exception of one invoice outstanding for \$500. Total fines issued for 2024 is \$17,150.00, current outstanding balance is \$1,600.00. The invoices are sent to the property owners.

The County has not had issues with property owners not paying invoices but does have the ability to add unpaid invoices to taxes if it becomes an issue in the future.

Progressive Communications Plan to Address Repeat False Alarms

As presented at the January 2025 Detachment Board meeting, a two-pronged communications strategy was approved for implementation, that includes the following elements:

1. Public Education: objective is to reduce the frequency of false alarms and response through targeted outreach, education, and policy enforcement. Tactics include direct communication (newsletters, web page), social media campaigns, media release, connect with Economic Development and Planning Divisions of the County. Potential costs are approximately \$1,200.
2. Individual Repeat Properties: in addition to current escalating fines and warning letters, provide property owners with educational resources (tip sheet), an on-site visit for the 3rd response and 5th response.

The County and OPP staff team working on this initiative are working on plans to initiate the strategy.

Summary and Recommendations

There is an overall decrease in the number of false alarm responses in January 2025 compared to January 2024; however, there is a significant increase in responses to repeat properties, largely attributed to one property owner in the County. The new communications plan targets individual

repeat properties. The effectiveness of this strategy will be monitored throughout the year and reported to the Board at future meetings.

Report

Background

In accordance with the Community Safety and Policing Act (CSPA) s. 71, the County of Brant O.P.P. detachment board prepared a 2025 budget estimate and submitted the estimate to the municipality. At the December 16, 2024 Detachment Board meeting, the Board approved the 2025 Draft County of Brant O.P.P. Detachment Board Budget. The draft budget was forwarded to County of Brant Council budget deliberations, which took place in January and February, 2025.

Analysis

County of Brant Council approved the 2025 O.P.P. Detachment Board budget, as presented, at the February 25, 2025 Council meeting. There were no adjustments made to the draft budget. The final budget is attached to this report at Attachment 1.

The final Detachment Board operating budget for 2025 is \$59,239. The budget includes detail on the amounts allocated for various initiatives. A one-time amount of \$5,000 is included for the Board's sponsorship of the 2025 Special Olympics.

Community engagement opportunities (\$2,500) and community sponsorships (\$1,000) are included within Public Relations/Awards. These are general accounts left to the discretion of the Board to determine how the funds are allocated.

The 2024 Year-to-date actuals are included in the attached document. County Treasury has not fully reconciled the 2024 accounts. A report is forthcoming to the Board with the final year-end variance once this has been completed.

Summary and Recommendations

The Board's 2025 budget as submitted to the County of Brant has been approved. The Board will be provided with regular variance reports throughout the year to monitor usage of budgeted funds.

With over 23,000 registered athletes participating in programs across the province, Special Olympics Ontario is the only organization that provides sports training and competition for individuals with intellectual disabilities.

The 2025 Provincial Summer Games, presented by the Wayne Gretzky Foundation, will be held in Brantford, Brant County and Six Nations from July 10-13, 2025. The Ontario Provincial Police, Brantford Police Service and Six Nations Police Service are all excited to welcome over 900 athletes from across Ontario to the County of Brant, Six Nations and the City of Brantford. Athletes will compete in five diverse and exciting sports: athletics, bocce, golf, soccer, and softball. These Games are the pinnacle of competition for Special Olympics athletes in Ontario and a celebration of the incredible athletic abilities of individuals with intellectual disabilities.

It is our request that the County of Brant OPP Detachment Board provide support to this monumental event through sponsorship, as every contribution helps. Special Olympics relies on community support for the event revenue to ensure the organizational goal of maintaining financial accessibility to these Games. That said, athlete registration is \$50, the same as it was in the 1990s. The true cost of these games including travel, accommodation, and competition is well over \$600 per athlete.
