Good afternoon.

I am writing to voice my concern over the proposed subdivision on CON 1 PT LOT 6 PT LOT 5 REG. County of Brant. Application number PS1-19-DN and application number ZBA5-19-DN.

I live at 176 Oakland Road and have lived here for 47 years. I am gravely concerned about the number of houses to be placed on the property and what that will do to affect my drinking water and those of my neighbours. I am on a well system here and I want to know exactly who do I sue when my well runs dry? Or conversely when the ground water is contaminated by sewage? I can't speak for my neighbours but I'm sure they are also gravely concerned. I understand that all (proposed) 22 houses will have their own well and sewage. Further this backs onto Mackenzie Creek which is a significant part of the Grand River Watershed. Is that not one of the sources of drinking water for the Six Nations of the Grand?

Further, what of preserving our agricultural land? I find putting 22 homes on prime agricultural land to be a waste of arable land. Not to mention the impact that it will have on wildlife in the area.

The increased traffic on Oakland Road is also a concern. More traffic. More pollution. Greater affect on wildlife. More cars means increased death toll on vulnerable Carolinian species in the area.

I am submitting this letter in protest of the proposed rezoning and building.
