# A Place to Grow (A.P.T.G.) Amendment #1 Key Changes to Growth Plan, 2019



### **Policies that Remain Unchanged**

- Majority of policies remain unchanged.
- Intensification and Designated Greenfield (D.G.A.) density targets.
- Growth Plan, 2019 Schedule 3
   Growth forecasts to 2031 & 2041
   will remain unchanged.
- Provincial Conformity date: remains as July 2022 (1 year later for lower-tiers). No transition policies are provided.

### **Proposed Policy Changes**

- Forecasts to 2051
  - Three ranges are proposed (low, reference and high scenario) supported by a 2020 Technical Report.
- Forecasts are to be considered "minimums".
- No forecast for lower-tier municipalities in Simcoe County (Schedule 7 is removed).
- New Land Needs Methodology
  - A less prescriptive, outcome-based new Land Needs Methodology (L.N.A.) as been proposed.







# County of Brant Population Growth Comparison, 2051



The range of forecast growth between the proposed low and high scenario in the 2020 Technical Report is very narrow. In 2041 the range is within 2,000 people and in 2051 within 3,000 people.

#### County of Brant Population Forecast Comparison, 2051





• By the year 2051, the County of Brant population is forecast to reach 61,000. This represents an increase of approximately 23,200 persons between 2016 and 2041.

#### County of Brant Recommended Population Forecast, 2016 to 2051



### County of Brant Employment Growth Comparison



 The range of forecast growth between the proposed low and high scenario in the 2020 Technical Report is quite broad. In 2041 the range is within 3,000 jobs and in 2051 within 6,000 jobs.




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## County of Brant Employment Forecast, 2016 to 2051



By 2051 the County's employment base is forecast to reach approximately 29,000. This represents an increase of just over 14,000 jobs between 2016 and 2051.
