There have been a lot of neighbors talking about this some nearby have no driveway to park in some never received a letter

I'm shocked that a proposed fee for a permit is required to park in front of your home I've never heard of such a thing! Is this a money grab by the County shameful with Covid going on ! If the lot around the corner is full the patrons need to be directed to Syl Apps with a safe crossing and the signage needs to be larger and more visual. What is there now is so faded you can hardly read it . Plus website should explain parking regulations so before the patrons come here they understand parking and fees for parking in the wrong spot

I'm quite upset about this I rode my bike around the streets near Elm, Walnut, Smith ,Willow and spoke to residents who never received info and will be not have a parking

spot as it will require a permit and they have no driveway so they rely on street parking It's great these patrons want to visit Paris love to see them have a nice time on the river but the residents on Elm Street like the parking on the street as it is. Everyone is aware of switching sides and we never have congestion and respect the neighbors driveways

Why is the County trying to push this through by then end of May? Why didn't they start sooner and ask for input from the residents? When Covid is more relaxed

what are we to do about visitors or workers?

Is this a permanent situation or just a tryout ?? so this is to run from May 31 to October 31 then what happens??Please don't penalize residents for living near the river access

perhaps a FREE resident pass to everyone on Elm Street then if they have a visitor or worker they can use this permit for the time they are at their home.
