There were fifteen mental health related calls in the month of September. The MCRRT worker attended nineteen crisis calls – some not mental health specific but assistance was still needed. There were seven (7) COAST referrals for follow up.


Of the fifteen mental health calls, five (5) resulted in apprehensions.

01 Sep 23	RIDE program initiated on Ayr Rd. Driver entered RIDE program with odour of alcohol on breath. Approved Screening Device administered and registered a fail. Driver arrested and
	taken for breath tests at detachment. Tests confirmed over legal limit and charged
	accordingly. Drivers licence suspension and vehicle impounded.
03 Sep 23	Traffic complaint reported to police reference a vehicle being operated at inconsistent
	speeds and driving between lanes. Police located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop.
	Driver displayed signs of obvious alcohol consumption and was arrested. Driver taken to
	detachment for breath tests and subsequent charges laid. Drivers licence suspension and
	vehicle impounded.
05 Sep 23	Police attended a motor vehicle collision on Hwy 403. During investigation, it was

TRENDS AND ACTIONS

- Violent Crime for September 2023 was up 5.6% compared to September 2022 and up 26.1% YTD. There was a decrease in assaults however there was an increase in other crimes against a person.
- Property Crime shows a decrease of 21.5% for September 2023 there were decreases in Thefts Under \$5000, Thefts Over \$5000 and Frauds. There was a 600% increase in mischief incidents for September 2023 vs 2022.
- There was no change YTD for Drug Crime compared to last year.
- In relation to motor vehicle collisions, there were no roadway fatalities in September and our Personal Injury Collisions decreased in September 2023 compared to September 2022. Property damage collisions show a decrease of 32.9%. Overall, we are 3.1% over 2022 collisions YTD.
- There were 8 stolen vehicles this month, and 14 recovered vehicles. Theft from Motor Vehicles occurrences were significantly down with only 8 occurrences, compared to 13 in September 2022.
- Mental Health calls (Level 1) show a decrease of 10% compared to September 2022. YTD we are at a 13.7% increase.
- 9-1-1 calls were up by one call for September 2023 compared to 2022.
- Alarm calls were slightly up for September by 22.7%.
- Domestic Disturbance calls increased this September by 4.3%.
