

## Brant County OPP Detachment Local Updates – January

### **Mental Health Liaison Officer**

#### **January**

There were twenty (32) mental health related calls in the month of January. The MCRT worker responded to four (4) crisis calls. There were five (5) new COAST referrals for follow up.

Of the thirty-two mental health calls, nine (9) resulted in apprehensions. Four (4) were admitted and

five (5) were released with follow-up care. Of the 5 released, two (2) were as a result of form 2 apprehensions.

The total time spent in the emergency room with apprehensions was 12hrs 55min (x2 officers)

- Comparison – Jan 2025 16hrs15min (x2 officers)

The mean time spent in the emergency room with apprehensions was 1h26min

- Comparison – Jan 2025 2hr19min

The time in the emergency room ranged from 29min – 2hr18min (x2 officers)

- Comparison – Jan 2025 - 29min – 5hr44min (x2 officers)

Police Hospital Transition protocol has been signed and training for officers and other signatories is

happening.

P.C. Kobyłka took part in various meetings including the Elder Abuse Committee, Woodview Suicide

Prevention, Brantford Immigration Partnership Lunch and Learns, and various grant meetings.

P.C. Kobyłka is assisting with the weekly Citizens Youth Police Academy.

The 2025/26 CSP grant with Darmont Gives Back and the County is underway with work being completed to bring supports and services to newcomers in the County of Brant.

### **YOUTH / SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER**

#### **January**

In the month of January 2026, there were 51 youth involved in a variety of occurrences ranging between criminal code, provincial offences, domestic and family disputes, mental health, and police assist calls. The outcome was five diversions or warns, seven HTA/POA charges, five

HTA warnings and four MHA apprehensions. None of the apprehended youth were formed. Of the 49 total occurrences, three had an online component.

In addition to regular visits to Paris District High School, PC Vitalis attended three elementary schools to deliver the OPP KIDS program to five grade six classes and assisted with the Brant OPP Youth Academy.
